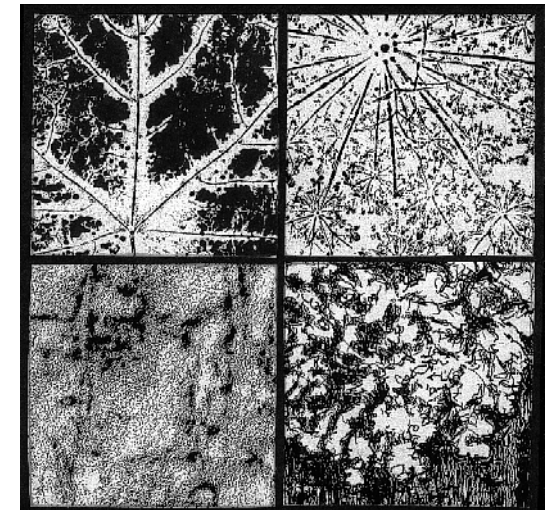

JUNE 26 BIRDING BY EAR (7 AM - 11 AM) NOTE TIME

Take an early morning hike in an Audubon site with birding expert Dana Richter. Under the guidance of musician/artist Melissa Davis, create percussion instruments with recycled and natural materials.

JULY 10 COPPER FALLS (9:30 AM - 1:30 PM)

Investigate the remnants of copper mining at the Copper Falls stamp sands with geologist Bill Rose. Artist Kayo Miwa will extend our exploration of this landscape to imprints and impressions.

JULY 17 MOSSES AS MONITORS (9:30 AM - 1:30 PM)

Explore the role of water, pollution, and human disturbance on mosses with bryologist Janice Glime. Artist Amy E. Arntson will teach a mini workshop on perception and how to use watercolors to express what we see.

AUG. 7 INVASIVE PLANTS (9:30 AM - 1:30 PM)
